BE IT RESOLVED, that upon the recommendation of the Interim Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education hereby appoints Dylan Steger as a Maintenance Mechanic III, in the non-competitive class of the civil service, to serve a twelvementh probationary term commencing January 29, 2024, at a rate of \$66,215 prorated, for the 2023-2024 school year, pending fingerprint clearance.
